**16 Teams Advance to National Science Bowl[®]
Championship Rounds**

WASHINGTON, DC – Sixteen high school teams triumphed today in the round robin tournament of the 2004 National Science Bowl[®] and will move on to the competition's final rounds. The finalist teams have won \$1,000 for their school's science departments.

Sponsored by the U.S. Department of Energy, the National Science Bowl[®] is the premier high school science and mathematics competition in the country. Sixty-four winning regional teams are gathered in Washington, D.C. for the event.

Secretary of Energy Spencer Abraham will make remarks and award trophies and prizes immediately following the competition.
