money?






What do I bring?



Clothes (sweater, rain gear, regional t-shirt, dress clothes and shoes, casual clothes, sneakers), shampoo, toothbrush, other toiletries, maybe a pillow, lucky trinkets, any textbooks (to cram), coat, umbrella, stuff to keep you busy. Don't bring jeans with holes or midriff tops, drugs, weapons, alcohol, or tobacco products. Each room has a bathroom, tv, beds, linens, towels, and soap.



Can I call home?



Yes—there's a phone in every room, but you are responsible for long-distance calls (this includes if you bring a computer and use your modem). (Parents—both the in-room televisions and the cyber café computers have parental controls. Parents can call the 4-H Center at 301-961-2801.)
